**Non-fiction:** Poetry about water. Non-chronological reports about the weather and its effects.




**Fiction**: Narrative using the text 'Lila and the Secret of Rain'.

Recognise and know the value of different coins and notes,

Tells the time to the nearest hour, including drawing clocks
