## Science

Living Things: Compare plants and animals in our local environment to those in the Caribbean. Describe life processes of plants. Find out about the work of Sir David Attenborough. Electricity: circuits, voltage, switches, components, symbols & diagrams. Working Scientifically: planning a scientific enquiry (plants), controlling variables, taking measurements, recording data and results, scientific diagrams, tables and graphs, predicting, fair testing, conclusions and explanations.

Number: number and place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, fractions, decimals and percentages. Strategies for written methods and problem solving.
