# English

#### 1. Reading Detectives

Read your book for 20 minutes each day then complete one of the following Reading Detectives activities.

**Mind Mapper:** Your job is to draw a mind map of the most important things in the passage or story.

**Illustrator**: Draw what you read about – a picture, cartoon, diagram.

**Actor**: Your job is to bring the character to life through acting.

**Word Finder:** Look for words that are interesting, confusing or new. Find out what they mean and share them.

#### 2. Diary

Write a diary about your day – remember to use your best punctuation and interesting words.

#### Maths

- 1. Go to the homework section of 'My Maths' where there will be current maths learning set for you to do that links with our learning in class. This should be completed before we return to school.
