

# Year 3 Home Learning Activities for during school closure time

## English

### 1. Reading Detectives

Read your book for 20 minutes each day then complete one of the following Reading Detectives activities.

**Mind Mapper:** Your job is to draw a mind map of the most important things in the passage or story.

**Illustrator:** Draw what you read about – a picture, cartoon, diagram.

**Actor:** Your job is to bring the character to life through acting.

**Word Finder:** Look for words that are interesting, confusing or new. Find out what they mean and share them.

### 2. Diary

Write a diary about your day – remember to use your best punctuation and interesting words.

## Maths

1. Go to the homework section of '[My Maths](#)' where there will be current maths learning set for you to do that links with our learning in class. This should be completed before we return to school.
2. **Times Tables.** Create a poster of the multiplication **and** division facts for the times tables you are learning. Make it colourful, fun and interesting.

## Be Active

### 1. Indoor Scavenger Hunt

See how many of the items on the attached sheet you can find. When you find one, either draw a small picture of it or describe where you found it. Try not to use the same thing twice.

### 2. Enjoy the Outdoors

### 3. Dance!

Make up a dance that reflects the weather outside and perform it to members of your family.

## 2. Drawing

- Draw the object from different angles then layer each picture on top of the other
