



Playground Rules

Information for all adults at school

- Remind children of the school's 'Golden Rules' (on back).
- **Patrol the playground** by walking around continuously and checking each group of children playing – using words from our 'Golden Rules' to check children are OK 'are you using kind words?' 'hands and feet to yourself'
- **Check the buddy bench** – is anyone waiting for someone to join them? Check children who are on their own.
- **Monitor games** and activities being played encouraging children to join in and share toys where necessary
- During lunchtime and playtime there must be at least one adult on the playground and one adult on the play equipment. The adults on duty should assess the safety of the equipment before allowing the children to play. (If too wet)
- **At break time KS1 will use the toilets in the main building and at lunchtime all children to use the toilets by the hall. Reception and KS1 have toilet buddies**
- **Football and balls:**
 - Break time – no balls
 - Dinner time – Football only allowed on the field when dry
- **Outdoor classroom** is designated as a quiet reading area – ensure it is being used appropriately and checked by Year 5 monitors.
- All milk and fruit is to be consumed on the patio area only and rubbish put in the bin.
- Children are not allowed to return to classrooms unless supervised.
- Children to 'freeze' when the bell is rung and then walk sensibly and line up in a 'quality line' in front of their class.

Golden Rules

1. We are kind, caring and polite to others.
2. We look after our school and each other.
3. We listen carefully.
4. We always try to do as we are asked.
5. We keep our hands and feet to ourselves

Wet Playtime

1. Table top games/play only. For example: drawing, colouring, dominoes, jigsaws, cards, puzzles
2. No running or chasing games
3. No laptops
4. Do not use classroom resources. For examples felt tips, glue etc.
5. Lunchtime supervisors are responsible for behaviour at this time.
6. Children must be given at least 5 minutes to tidy up (12.45pm)

Recognition and Consequences

Good behaviour stickers should be awarded for superb playground behaviour.

A Yellow Card should be given if Golden Rules are broken, unless the behaviour deserves a straight Red Card.

A Red Card should be given for dangerous or inappropriate behaviour.

Examples of when children think that recognition and consequences should be given are in each classroom.

These rewards and sanctions follow the school 'system'
