In this newsletter we aim to give you a brief overview of what governors do and who we are.

The Governing Body together with the Head teacher and senior staff, are the school Leadership and Management team. We share responsibility

governors have brought the school from being a small, first school, catering for children from Reception to Year 3, to a full primary school. This included two major building projects and significant fundraising (which is ongoing).

Governors need to hold the school to account for performance in terms of the attainment levels our pupils achieve and the progress they make throughout the school. We also need to ensure that the school is making the best use of the resources we have (our time, budget, staff,

## Practicalities of being a governor

Unpaid volunteer

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Six governing body meetings a year (one per term). Three are full governing body meetings and three are subcommittee meetings (each governor is on either the Staffing and Curriculum or Finance and Premises subcommittee).

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Governors take on specific areas of responsibility e.g.
Health and Safety,
Safeguarding, SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability), Pupil Premium.
Governors arrange monitoring visits and write up a visit report each year for the governing body, which can also be reviewed by Ofsted as evidence of governor involvement.

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Governors sit on panels e.g. Heads Review, Admissions, Complaints.

Additional sub-committees and panels are formed as and when there is a need.

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Governors also attend governor training.

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#### Governors Vacancies

All governing bodies comprise of up to six different types of governors including parent, staff, Local Authority and Foundation governors - governors appointed by the church. We currently have eleven governors and seven vacancies. However, we have just begun discussions on reconstituting. This is something we legally have to do by September 2015, meaning we need to decide how many and what type of governors we want in the future. The general idea is that smaller governing bodies are just under £12,000 left to more responsive and effective. We will keep you up to date on discussions and once we know what vacancies we have, we will be asking for nominations for potential new governors.

#### **Fundraisina**

As mentioned earlier, our school has grown in size and numbers over the last few years. As a church school this meant that we had to fund 10% of the build costs. A fantastic job has already been done by previous and current parents in raising £67,000. We now have raise to clear the loan. The governors would like to thank Worlebury Friends for re-establishing last year, for putting on so many successful events in such a short space of time and for agreeing to donate 60% of their profits to paying off the loan. We are very grateful and looking forward to what you have planned this year.

#### Extra money for our school?

From September 2014 all Reception, Year 1 and 2 pupils are automatically entitled to free school dinners every day. This is great news for our youngest pupils and families. However, it's possible that your child may also be entitled to free school meals through years 3-6, depending on your personal circumstances.

Our school is entitled to extra money, known as the Pupil Premium, to support pupils from low income families who are eligible for free school meals, even during the period when they are automatically entitled. Even if your child was only eligible briefly, £1,300 per pupil per year is available to Worlebury to provide additional services across the school to help raise the attainment of pupils from low-income families and to close the gap between them and their peers. The governors monitor how effectively this money is being spent.

Free school meal enquiries are dealt with by the school office confidentially and sensitively and other pupils have no way of knowing who is receiving them. Please contact the school office for more information and help with the relevant forms involved.
