### February 2016

#### From the Vicar

I write this after Sunday lunch of bacon and eggs (delicious thanks Joan) having giving St Peter's quite a "roughing up" this morning. I was preaching on the "many parts but one body" (1 Cor 12) and how some people are in danger of becoming "spare parts". I think I may have been a little carried away, so before I continue I need to assure you all (on both sides of the hill) how much I appreciate everything you do for the Lord in our churches. I made the point about spare parts because over the years I've put many a good and potentially useful thing in my garage thinking it may come in handy one day. The problem is that if or when that day ever comes, I either can't find it or it's become broken or rusty (or both). How can we prevent ourselves from such a fate? **Praise the Lord!** 

I was planning to do something on Isaiah this Lent, but after searching high and low I couldn't find anything suitable, yet as soon as someone asked if we could do something on praise I suddenly found loads of material. That's what we call the workings of the Spirit! So instead of Isaiah (who is still waiting in the wings) our Lent Course this year will look at how we are citizens of heaven, and in our heavenly home they praise God all day and every day. So we should be doing the same—constantly singing the Lord's song in this strange land - rejoicing in the sure and certain promise that we are on our way home. We are "ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven" as the famous hymn puts it, and no matter how much pain, temptation and misery the enemy may throw at us, we can laugh it back in his face. How do we do that? **Praise the Lord!** 

When we are praising God we're not thinking of all the things piling up on our "to-do" lists, we're not worrying about what tomorrow may bring, and we're not fretting about something that happened yesterday. (Remember—when the devil reminds you of your past, just remind him of his future). Best of all, when we are praising God we are being powerful witnesses to the people around us. No one likes a long face, but smiles are infectious! Our Lent course follows the usual home-group slots of Wednesday mornings and Thursday mornings + evenings, with an addition session on Sunday afternoons at 3pm. More details can be found on page 3. The name of our course? **Praise the Lord!** 

Speaking of the enemy, we've been under attack again at St Peter's, with graffiti and criminal damage to our recently landscaped garden of remembrance. The police know whose behind it all and it's just a matter of time before they catch them red-handed. To help we are installing CCTV cameras and getting back into the habit of setting the alarm system every night. This is quite a logistical nightmare as so many people currently have access. So we'll be changing the codes on the door in the very near future, which means that if you have the door-code you will have to ask Michelle for the new one AND the alarm codes. Ideally the fewer people in possession of these codes the better for security and administration purposes, so if you don't really need regular access we'd rather you arrange your visits when Michelle is in the office. One thing we can all do is to PRAY for protection of our church buildings and grounds.
