#### From the Vicar

St Peter's PCC recently agreed to reduce their 8am communion services to two a month, on the first and third Sundays. I'm hoping St Paul's will follow suite, hosting the second and fourth Sundays. This would mean that when your 10am service is "All Age", communion will be available at the 8am in your "home" church. This is all to be confirmed but I felt the need to mention it here as there seem to be some misunderstandings.

First of all I need to stress that this is not entirely due to a shortage of clergy, (although it must be said that most of my retired colleagues would prefer not to rise at such an early hour, especially as the cold, dark winter mornings approach!) This matter came to the fore when I tried unsuccessfully to arrange 8am holiday cover for September/October. Bearing in mind our faithful but ageing clergy and with no guarantee of any others coming to retire here, this shortage is unlikely to improve. But there is also a matter of falling congregation numbers at these services. On recent Sundays we've been as low as 4 on both sides of the hill. John Hayward has kindly agreed to continue with the 8ams, (including 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays and my holidays) but even he agrees these days are numbered and we should be proactive in preparing for the inevitable. I understand some people are planning to come to the 8am communions to help the regulars "save their service". This is somewhat misguided as the regulars have seen this coming for some time and have raised absolutely no objections—in fact, some admit they only come every week to support the clergy!

We are however, a United Benefice - one church – and I thank those St Paul's folk who supported St Peter's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, this was also noticed and appreciated by the Bishop when he came. St Peter's will continue to hold the 10am communion service on Wednesdays and those who missed their 8am on a Sunday will be made more than welcome at that service.

Another misrepresentation heard recently is the word "permanent". This is not a case of managing decline, but focussing of efforts with the resources currently at our disposal. I prefer to be proactive in rationalising our mission as one church – for now. I'll never forget one particular prophet of doom, who predicted St Peter's would be closed in six months' time. That was about ten years ago! Both our churches have had, and will continue to experience times of growth and decline. I never say "never" and I never say "forever". Who knows what the Lord may bring in the years to come? These measures are by no means an admission of defeat, neither are they permanent—we are simply cutting the cloth for now and will continue to monitor things.

This proposal will make no difference to the current level at which I serve you. I will still lead two communion services every Sunday just as before. The difference will come when we no longer need to seek cover for holidays and sickness, with this new arrangement, all services could be covered by one priest and – as already mentioned – John remains available for the foreseeable future.

As mentioned at the top, this is all in the pipeline and everyone will be given plenty of notice as and when it begins. However, you will be getting a taste of things to come on September 20<sup>th</sup> when John is taking the 8am at St Paul's and there will be no service at St Peter's. The following Sunday (27<sup>th</sup>) things will reverse with the 8am at St Peter's and none at St Paul's. On the last Sunday of my holiday (Oct 4<sup>th</sup>) John will be back at St Paul's and there will be no 8am at St Peter's. I thank you in advance for what I know will be your most gracious and generous patience and understanding.



### Tax Justice

The Diocese of Bath and Wells has joined with Christian Aid South West to call for tax justice and raise awareness of the impact of tax dodging not only in our country, but for developing countries such as Zambia.

Changes in tax laws, systems and practices can have a hugely positive impact on the financial resources available for ending poverty. Taxation enables governments to build infrastructure, provide schools, hospitals and healthcare. It enables the creation of a safety net for the most vulnerable in society. In many developing countries, multinational companies dodge paying tax which means those countries lose vital income that they could use to lift themselves out of poverty, instead of being reliant on aid.

#### Calling for Tax Justice: discussion starters for church groups

As part of our commitment to the generous sharing of the Earth's resources and for tax systems that work for the good of all, we have worked with Christian Aid to produce a booklet for churches which can be used as a discussion starter for church groups.

'As Christians we are called to act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with our God. This new resource gives us the opportunity to learn about the issue of tax justice, the impact of tax avoidance on our brothers and sisters in Zambia and reflect upon the role we can play in bringing good news to the poor' The Right Reverend Peter Hancock, Bishop of Bath and Wells.

### **Serving Your Local Community**

Have you ever thought of becoming a Church School Foundation Governor?

The Diocesan Board of Education (the DBE) appoints over 400 foundation governors to be part of the governing body of its family of 180 Church of England schools across the Diocese.

Governing bodies are crucial in the successful running and management of schools and the people who give up their time to volunteer as school governors do so in the knowledge that they are serving their community and making a real difference to the lives of children.

As a new initiative, the DBE is looking to develop a 'pool' of volunteers who would be willing to serve as foundation governors to fill existing and future vacancies. In order to do this, we are working with SGOSS (School Governor One Stop Shop), a government funded, not-for-profit organisation who help recruit governors to schools across the country. Look out for the advertising campaign that will be coming to your parish

If you think that school governance isn't for you, or that you can't commit the time, then how about volunteering as an Admissions Appeals Panel Member? Sometimes, parents are unsuccessful in securing their preferred school place for their child and on the occasions that this happens, they have a right to appeal the decision. Independent panels are set up to hear the appeal and if it is a church school, then the panel needs to have a church representative on it. Full training is provided by the Diocese's Admissions Consultant.

### **RESPONDING TO THE REFUGEE CRISIS**

## A pastoral letter from the Bishop of Bath and Wells

We have all been shocked and upset by the recent pictures from Calais, Hungary and – most distressingly – the beach in Turkey where the body of little Aylan Kurdi was washed ashore.

It feels as if there has been a breakdown in the human race's ability to care for its weakest members. While the big picture of politics and civil war perplexes us, the individual tragedies go straight our hearts. We all want to do something.



The plans announced by the Prime Minister relate only to bringing to Britain refugees from the camps established in the countries surrounding Syria. With the vast numbers of refugees looking for support in Europe, I echo Archbishop Justin's comment that this is a slim response. There is human need on our doorstep as well. The United Kingdom could and should do more as a nation to help our European partners as they struggle to deal with all this. You may want to write to your MP about this.

Our churches have already been asking what they can do to help, and collections of money and goods have already been taking place on a more or less ad hoc basis. We see practical needs, and it is natural to want to help. However, rather than start up lots of small-scale collections, I would encourage churches to work through established agencies who are already working in the field. These agencies have the skills and experience to do this work – whether that be at Calais or in Jordan, the Lebanon, or Syria itself. As regards the people at Calais, the UK and France are well-resourced countries. The agencies on site can buy what they need if they have the money: collecting and delivering supplies may not be the most helpful thing unless it is known there are resources to deliver and distribute them fairly.

Some people have already expressed their desire to open their home to a refugee family. offering rooms or meals. This is a generous and hospitable gesture. The time is not yet right for this to happen – we will have to wait for the Government's relocation scheme to be worked out. When refugees arrive, churches will be in the forefront of those offering assistance, and we will need to do this well. It will not be an easy task. There will be issues of language, dealing with vulnerable and traumatised people, finding suitable schools, and so on. Again, we will do best to work with agencies who know what they are doing.


