## From the Vicar

By the time you read this we will have welcomed Peter and Tamsin back to St Paul's for the baptism of young Matthew. I'm sure it will be a very special occasion for us all and it will be great to catch up with all the Berry family. I think you all know my views on baptising babies, but it's always that extra-special when I know the parents and godparents come fully understanding what they are doing and why, with a sincere wish to bring their child into the heart of God's family. I've shifted a long way from trying to persuade parents away from baptism and toward a Thanksgiving Service. But I still explain to them why I think infant baptism is a nonsense, if nothing else it makes people think about the real meaning of baptism and the importance of their vows. Just occasionally, having had it all explained to them, they choose to have a Thanksgiving instead. However, if they still insist on a baptism, I would never allow my personal opinion to stand in their (or God's) way.

So having made an informed decision, the parents and I are then faced with another dilemma, when do we do it? Some clergy insist that baptisms must take place within the main Sunday morning service. After all, a major part of the rite is to welcome the child and family into the church, and that can only happen when the main body of the church is present. However, there are several reasons why I sometimes offer a 'private' baptism in the afternoon. For starters the main 10am is usually a communion service, which is not very user-friendly if you're not a regular churchgoer and besides, baptism parties often include many children who can become a little tetchy when faced with a long 'grown-up' service. Any attempt to make the communion service more child-friendly incurs the wrath of the more traditional members of our churches and it's not long before some vote with their feet! Another problem with morning baptisms is when family members have a long way to travel and don't want an overnight stay. Yet another problem, especially at St Paul's, is the matter of space. Baptism parties are often up to 60. Adding that number of 'strangers' can disrupt a service considerably and I'm aware that some regulars give it a miss if they know there's going to be a baptism.

So what do we do? Well for starters I must accept that I can't please all of the people all of the time and stop beating myself up every time I 'weaken' and let them have a pm service. Secondly, those who grumble about baptisms upsetting their Sunday mornings must be more tolerant and selfless in welcoming newcomers into our midst, to share the faith they hold so preciously, even though these families often never cross the threshold again. Which brings me to my third and most important point – we must remember that baptism, like weddings and funerals, may be the only occasions when some people would ever consider coming to church, and that makes this a rare and perfect opportunity to sow the seed, to show them Christ's love, to welcome them into His family and teach them His ways. So I will continue to offer afternoon baptisms, but I promise to try a little harder in future to persuade them to come and join us in the mornings where I'm sure they will be warmly welcomed into the heart of God's family.

## Preparations continue for Archbishop's visit

The finishing touches are being made to the itinerary for the visit of the Most Revd Justin Welby, the Archbishop of Canterbury from Monday 7 to Wednesday 9 November. The visit will see him crisscross the diocese and give him the opportunity to meet and pray with individuals and groups working on issues of importance in the diocese, including rural issues, education and the environment, as well as ministry and mission.

Monday 7 will see him arrive in Taunton where he will meet with educators from across the diocese before travelling to Exmoor to hear from individuals concerned with rural issues. On Tuesday he will work his way up to Wells, stopping at Glastonbury to undertake a prayer walk up the Tor.

Clergy and readers will be among those invited to attend a service with the Archbishop on Tuesday afternoon at Wells Cathedral. There will also be an opportunity to join him 'in conversation' at a public event at the Cheese and Grain in Frome at 7.30 on Tuesday evening. Tickets will be available soon via the Cheese and Grain website.

On Wednesday, after enjoying a breakfast with those involved with young vocations, he will head to Bath to find out about social action projects in the city and also inspect Bath Abbey's Footprint project. His visit will conclude with a farewell Eucharist at the Abbey.

Looking ahead I am excited that the Archbishop of Canterbury is visiting our diocese for three days in November. I'm excited because he'll be praying with us, encouraging us in our new strategy to put mission and evangelism at the heart of everything we do, and encouraging us at parish level to be active in our local communities. The programme for 7<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> is still being finalised, but I am delighted he will be visiting all three archdeaconries, meeting farmers and overseas students, leading a prayer walk, speaking in several venues and hopefully experiencing and enjoying something of the scenery he will see as he travels among us.

I have had the privilege of meeting Archbishop Justin on a number of occasions and I am humbled and encouraged by his faith and commitment. This is the grace of God, working through the Holy Spirit and through his followers.
