Parent/Carer Questionnaires

Thank you to all who completed our recent Parent View Questionnaires, your constructive feedback is greatly appreciated. As you can see from the attached charts, the responses (43 in total) are positive with clear areas that we can improve upon. Below are some of the comments that were made in response to our school's vision of embracing 'Learning without Limits' (LwL):

- Little things like using stickers for acknowledging hard work and skills are very rewarding to our children and have a positive impact on them.
- For parents who haven't been able to come along to Worlebury Conferences and / coffee mornings, the sharing of information from these through the school newsletter helps to keep them informed.
- Children feel proud and respond well to the learning disposition stickers. In response to a parent saying they can't do something the child replied, "No Mummy, you can't do it YET". Another parent shared that they thought learning dispositions are crucial for learning and life.
- The conference was really informative and it was interesting to see some of the suggestions around Learning without Limits already happening in school.
- Comments were shared around outdoor learning and the positive use of the local area, particularly the woods. Also children enjoyed reading in unusual places, like the reading in tents for Book Day!

The following suggestions were made (and questions asked) that could help us to improve things further:

Clearer communication between home and school. We try very hard to keep communication open between home and school and it is our hope that when we have launched our new website this will

- improve again. Please see the clarification regarding the communication books.
- > Transition arrangements between year groups. When we plan transition in the summer term, we will take on board this feedback and ensure it is smoother.
- Extend After School Club to 6pm. This is something that we have already discussed with Sport to Schools and unfortunately, at this time, they are unable to extend beyond 5.30pm.
- Provide more sports at lunchtimes. We employ Sport to Schools coaches to run different sports during the lunchtimes. We will feedback to the coaches and ask them to provide more variety of sporting activities.
- With the DfE's expectation that all children need to attain the age related expectations of their year group, and the focus on getting all children to that point, will the most capable children get stretched? All children's progress is individually tracked so to ensure that all our children are challenged within their own learning. As a school that embraces 'Learning without Limits', we firmly believe that all children are capable of anything and therefore are capable of achieving and exceeding their age related If you have any expectations. concerns regarding your child's progress, please discuss this with their class teacher this week in parents' evening.

Communication Books
