Reading at Home!

Reading is the fundamental skill that pupils learn from an early age at school. There are many examples of research which indicate that pupils who read regularly from a young age do *much better* in their education and achievement in the future. This is why we place a lot of importance on reading in school with our Guided Reading sessions and our emphasis on phonics.

We are aware that a number of pupils have increased their frequency of reading at home – thank you! However, there are still some children who read infrequently. Once your child is a fluent reader they still need to read with an adult at home so that they can practice reading aloud with expression and intonation as well as spending some time talking about the book (applies to all readers).

Please remember to sign a reading record book to indicate that you have heard your child read. There are plenty of books in our class libraries which include recommended, age-appropriate texts which pupils can borrow for their free reading at home. Sometimes the issue with reading is simply because children find it difficult to find a book that appeals, or they need time to really immerse themselves in the story. They need support with this from all adults in their lives! Also, to see their parents reading for pleasure is a great way to raise the profile of reading!
